Timeline:

On March 11, 2022, the TGSA Board voted to accept me (Mia Theocharis) as the Chief Returning Officer (CRO) for the 2022 TGSA Nominations/Elections.

On April 6, 2022, an email was sent to all TST graduate students notifying them that the nomination period would begin on April 8, 2022 and end on April 25, 2022. In this email, I also let students know of the vacant positions that would need to be filled and expressed how important it was for everyone to take part in this process.

On April 8, 2022, I sent a second email to TST graduate students notifying them that the nomination period had officially commenced; and on April 18, 2022, I sent the final reminder email letting students know to send in their nominations. Remarks:

Unfortunately, there was little interest in the vacant positions this year. This may be due to the nature of the positions themselves, or because of COVID-19. However, it should also be noted that historically there has been a general apathy towards joining student councils at TST. This may be something for the future board to consider.

The priority right now would be to look to fill the VP External, VP Conference and Treasurer positions. The board may need to approach more people individually or see if TST/the colleges could help. The Graduate Studies Council (GSC) will meet in June 2022 — you could let the graduate directors know you are looking for students to get involved and they might be able to help. Also, orientation in September will be another key place for recruitment, especially for the Secretary, MA Rep and College Rep positions.

Another important point I'd like to express: It is not solely the job of the TGSA Board to fill the positions but of all TST graduate students. If you cannot find individuals to fill the positions, do not stress and work with what you have. If that means less events/workshops because the board is spread too thin than so be it. Do what you can! As your CRO, I have done everything possible (and a bit more) to find individuals willing to serve and unfortunately, the results were not very fruitful. But I am extremely thankful to the individuals who have offered their time and energy to sit on the board and I wish you all the best of luck next year.
